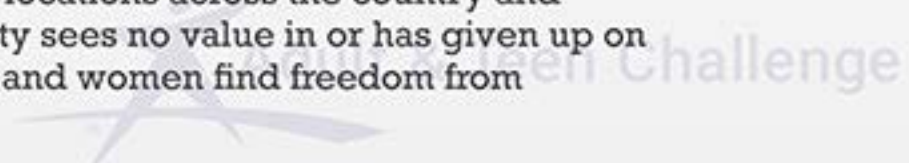
# ADULT & TEEN CHALLENGE INTERNATIONAL, U.S.A.

Adult & Teen Challenge offers Christ-centered, faith-based solutions to youth, adults and families who struggle with life-controlling issues.

Overcoming addiction requires focus on the condition of a person's heart, not just the addiction they struggle with. True transformation only comes through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

Participants in Adult & Teen Challenge programs also engage in discipleship programs to help them become more secure in their newfound faith, which strengthens their chances of success once they leave the residential center. A recent study by the Center for Compassion at Evangel University shows that the Adult & Teen Challenge program has a success rate of 78 percent, much higher than secular treatment programs.

There are currently over two hundred Adult & Teen Challenge locations across the country and several in Central Canada. Thousands of individuals that society sees no value in or has given up on are reached each year. Through Adult & Teen Challenge, men and women find freedom from addiction and freedom in Christ.





# CHAPLAINCY MINISTRIES

Chaplaincy Ministries recruits, trains and deploys chaplains to serve in areas where few Christians can — or even dare — enter. Chaplains serve in high-risk areas such as the military, police, fire departments, prisons and disasters. You will also find them on school campuses, in corporations, in hospitals, climbing mountains, at rodeos, on motorcycles, and with orphans, just to name a few places of ministry.

Chaplains go where the people are. They exercise the ministry of presence. They build relationships with people who need Jesus, and every day they have opportunities to talk about Him. They minister to people from birth to end of life.

Chaplains are ministers of the gospel endorsed to do specialized work. These men and women are called to cultural groups or situational/vocational locations to exemplify God's love to individuals in desperate need of Him.

# CHURCH MOBILIZATION

Church Mobilization serves the Assemblies of God by providing opportunities to be involved in ministry, either as a church group or as individuals. Church Mobilization offers evangelism and construction support to other missionaries and AG churches, districts, colleges and other facilities across our nation.

Church teams participate in evangelism projects, construction projects or both. These teams can vary in scope, and their trips last for a short period of time (from a few days to a week or more). Missionary Associates (MAs) usually commit to one to two years of service and work alongside a ministry leader. You will often find an MA helping with administration or maintenance work. This is a great opportunity for anyone who wants to assist a missionary from office work and beyond.

RVers come from a variety of professional and vocational backgrounds and ages. Many are retired or near retirement. RVers can serve for a few weeks to months at a location, and several spend an entire an entire year traveling across the United States assisting missionaries and ministries on construction projects.



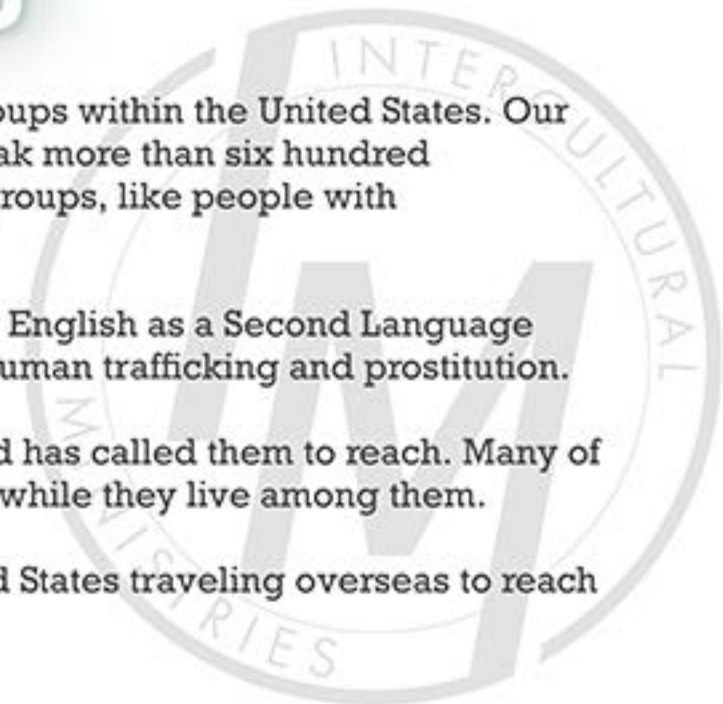
# INTERCULTURAL MINISTRIES

Intercultural Ministries serves the diverse cultural, ethnic and language groups within the United States. Our nation is called home by over five hundred diverse people groups who speak more than six hundred languages. Intercultural missionaries also minister to those in compassion groups, like people with disabilities, the blind, the deaf, human trafficking and foster care.

Many Intercultural missionaries build relationships with people by teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) classes in their community. Others rescue women and children from human trafficking and prostitution.

Intercultural missionaries are equipped and trained to reach the people God has called them to reach. Many of them spend time learning the cultural norms and expectations of the group while they live among them.

God is bringing the world to our doors. Instead of Christians from the United States traveling overseas to reach the world with the gospel, God is bringing the world here.






# U.S. MISSIONS SPECIALIZED

The opportunity for missions in America is limitless. Personnel in the U.S. Specialized window are a perfect example of this as they continually expand missions paradigms. They operate in unique assignments, often serving in niche or one-of-a-kind roles. Additionally, missionaries-in-residence serve in Assemblies of God higher education institutions to help students steward their call to missions, whether vocationally or in marketplace contexts. Specialized personnel also work within AG network contexts and with AGUSM personnel in other windows to advance various missions initiatives, emphases and assignments.






# YOUTH ALIVE

The middle school and high school campus is still one of the most strategic mission fields in the United States. Nearly eight of every ten decisions for Christ will be made by those under the age of eighteen. More than 98 percent of the American population will pass through at least one of the sixty-seven thousand junior high and high schools in the nation. There is no better place in America to reach the largest group of unreached students and their families in one place at one time.

Youth Alive missionaries equip students to reach students for Christ. Their goal is to know God and to make Him known. Youth Alive partners with churches to connect them to schools in their communities. Students in Youth Alive are a great bridge between the local church and the local schools.

Through Youth Alive, students understand that they don't have to wait until they're grown-ups to reach others with the gospel. Sharing God's love starts now. Youth Alive is more than just a program — it can be ingrained into the culture of what a youth group does.
